

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES POLICY FRAMEWORK (IPPF)

- **DSWD MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR 01
*SERIES OF 2009***

- Recognition of the historical circumstance leading to the marginalized and vulnerable situation of the indigenous peoples and the need to respond to this in the DSWD programs and services

- Legal bases:

- 1987 Philippine Constitution**

- RA 8371 Indigenous Peoples Rights Act**

1. To ensure the full and meaningful IP participation/empowerment

(Plans, programs and services are committed to genuine participation of the stakeholders with the IPs as the principals: they are actively involved in the conceptualization, implementation and evaluation of the activity as it is in these processes that their capacity is developed and empowerment takes place)

2. To promote IP rights

(The program, services or activity is structured in such a way that the rights of the IPs are upheld)

3. To protect the IPs from any adverse results during the development processes.

(The program, project, activity is structured and conducted in such a way that it does not “increase the vulnerability of the marginalized IPs”)

IPPF IN THE CONTEXT OF PANTAWID PAMILYANG PILIPINO PROGRAM

- **PANTAWID PROGRAM**

Poverty alleviation intervention aimed at breaking the intergenerational cycle of poverty by using the strategy of conditional cash grants (CCT) with conditions of availment of health and education services; and attendance/participation in family development sessions (FDS)
